Fylde Borough Council intend to close this car park and on 6 July submitted planning application 5/2005/0651 to develop 40 dwellings. The closing date for objections is 1st August and the application will be discussed by planning committee on 24th August 2005.

Although there is a full Council Meeting Fylde Borough Council 28th July at Lowther Gardens 7.00pm this matter will not be debated, instead the decision will be taken by the planning committee on 24th August. This means that the majority of councillors will have no input to the decision on the future of the car park.

Although a decision has not yet been taken to close the car park, the submission of the planning application by the council indicates that the decision will be imminent.
